The TYPES conference is a major annual event of the type theory community in Europe. Topics covered there are in line with the objectives of *WG6 (Type Theory)*. In our work, we compare the notions of quotient- and symmetric "containers". Both describe the syntax for polymorphic programming with quotient data types, and our work aims to clarify how their semantics relate (RCO-7: *Develop a modular theory of type theories*). The goal is to receive feedback on our results from the community, identify further avenues of research, and establish collaborations with members of WG6.
